



The Duke Clinical Research Institute is seeking to recruit a Senior Clinical Investigator to lead our Health Services and Outcomes Research Group. As an academic research organization, the DCRI develops and shares knowledge through innovative clinical research that improves the care of patients around the world. DCRI is internationally known for its history of leading and executing health services and outcomes research, which aim to generate evidence to improve health and care delivery.

The Health Services and Outcomes Research group combines the talents of experienced faculty, operational leaders, and clinical researchers to conduct a variety of studies including clinical registries, quality improvement programs, real world evidence generation, and health policy. The group of researchers and operational leaders foster a collaborative approach integrating clinical care, patient engagement and scientific collaboration to conduct high quality, practice or policy-changing studies. The group is also well known for leading novel methods that aim to enhance the methods of clinical research including engagement, clinical operations, data solutions, and regulatory science.

The successful individual will have a track record of externally funded research programs. In collaboration with the HSR operations leadership, the successful candidate will provide vision, strategic direction and oversight for clinical research activities within the business unit. They will also direct, mentor, and provide oversight to faculty across multiple therapeutic areas performing clinically oriented research; liaise with the School of Medicine Departments and Divisions, and have the opportunity to recruit additional faculty to develop a robust clinical research program. The successful candidate will hold a doctoral degree, or its equivalent, and have relevant experience running an independent, externally funded, clinical research program

Minimum qualifications: The successful faculty candidate will be a well-regarded active clinician (i.e. MD), or PhD with a history of high quality multicenter clinical research. Experience in managing large teams is essential, as is the ability to develop strong relationships with external academic collaborators as well as commercial sponsors. Excellent interpersonal skills are essential for success including effective listening and communication skills in a cross functional environment, recognizing the needs of many constituent groups in many different types of operating cultures.

Finally, the successful candidate will be a proponent of gender and race diversity in the clinical research workforce, and embrace the advantages of a diverse work force as an advocate in the research communities.
