## **Frequently Asked Questions:**

## **Eligibility:**

- Q: Can I apply if I am not a rising senior in high school in the fall?
- A: Rising juniors may apply; however, preference for admission will be granted to rising seniors and older students
- Q: Can I apply if I am not 18 years old?
- A: Yes, however, if you are not 18 years old by the time the in-person program starts (6/22/2026), you are not eligible to shadow faculty in the clinics or hospital.
- Q: Can I apply if I am not a US citizen or permanent resident (green card holder)?
- A: No, per NIH policy, only US citizens or permanent residents are eligible to apply.

## **Application Requirements:**

- Q: Can I submit my transcript after the deadline?
- A: No, all requirements must be submitted by the deadline.
- Q: Can I submit an unofficial transcript?
- A: Yes.
- Q: Can I submit my letter of recommendation with my application?
- A: No, letters of recommendation must be submitted by the letter writer through the link provided on the website.
- Q: When is the deadline to submit a letter of recommendation?
- A: Letters of recommendation must be submitted by the deadline otherwise your application will be incomplete and will not be considered for review.
- Q: Is there a prompt that letter writers should follow/answer?
- A: No.
- Q: Can my letter writer submit their letter of recommendation before I submit my application?
- A: Yes
- Q: Can I submit my application by email?
- A: No, applications must be submitted online by following the link on the website.

## Other FAQs:

- Q: Are accepted participants required to stay on campus?
- A: No.
- Q: Do you give recommendations on where to stay for out of state participants?
- A: No. Accepted participants are responsible for finding their own housing and transportation.
- Q: I did not get accepted in the program but I am really interested in medicine and research, can I join the program even if I don't get a stipend?
- A: No.

- Q: Do you have a waitlist?
- A: No.
- Q: I did not get accepted for this summer, can I re-apply?
- A: Yes.
- Q: I will be a rising college freshman in the fall, will I be considered as a college participant or high school participant?
- A: You will be considered as a college participant.
- Q: Is there a cost to apply?
- A: No.
- Q: What is the time commitment?
- A: Participants are required to attend in person for 6/22/2026-7/24/2026, Monday-Friday, business hours .
- Q: When does the application period begin and end?
- A: The application period is from November to first week of January. Please check the website for actual dates in October.
- Q: My parent(s) are duke alumni, do I get preferential treatment?
- A: No, your application will be rated based on your own accomplishments.
